Who We Are

The Pre-Collegiate Program of Yangon is a not-for-profit educational organization that since 2003 has provided Myanmar students with the opportunities and abilities to become agents of change. At PCP, students develop the skills and passion to succeed at universities abroad and become effective leaders in their communities. The curriculum consists of an intensive 16-month course of study that includes rigorous liberal arts classwork, extracurricular engagement, and cross-cultural exchanges. Ninety two percent of our students matriculate to colleges abroad, largely in the U.S., and the vast majority return to Myanmar upon finishing their studies. Our graduates' abilities to learn both in and out of the classroom, critique, communicate, empathize, and innovate sets them apart.
